Why use BIBTEX?

- avoid minutiae
- flexibility
- ease of data entry





New features:

- eight-bit input
- multiple bibliographies within a document
- enhanced sorting capabilities
- reference-list pointers to in-text citations
- mechanism for 'also appeared as'
- more flexible (LA)T_EX citation commands

New features:

- a \bibtexoptions command
- a .bib-entry consolidation mode
- an @ALIAS feature
- a @MODIFY command
- some changes to the standard styles
 - a few more standard entrytypes
 - a few more standard fields
- a few more .bst-language primitives

- BIBTEX 0.99 bug fixes
